

**PROBLEM-SOLVING PLAN TEMPLATE: COMMUNITY SAFETY PARTNERSHIP AWARD  
PROGRAMME 2005-08**

**PRIORITY 1: Safer Homes – Reducing Accidental House Fires, Home Accidents and Housebreaking**

Evidence to support Priority

In the UK every year, almost 4,000 people die in home accidents and 2.7 million visit their local accident and emergency departments seeking help. In **Scotland** this translates to 226 home accident related deaths in 2003. Whilst such deaths have fallen dramatically since 1980 figures of over 700, hospital admissions, however, increased dramatically over the same period to 17,269. The Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents suggests that proportionately in Scotland, around 1,000 people are seeking some sort of medical attention EVERY DAY following a home accident. The benefits of prevention are clear and quantifiable in terms of health and economic costs:

- Potential to save lives
- Quality of life
- The cost of acute care
- The cost of continued community support required after hospital discharge.

- Over 45% of A&E admissions in Aberdeen are due to home accidents, particularly involving children and older people
- Higher than average levels of home accident related A&E admissions from specific neighbourhoods within the City as highlighted within the City's Draft Regeneration Strategy.

Child Accident Prevention has been identified as a priority issue in both the Grampian Health Plan and in the City's Joint Health Improvement Plan.

In addition to the Community Safety audit information, the Police National Intelligence Model Strategic Quarterly documents and divisional analyst reports on Housebreaking.

The Audit Scotland Report – Performance Indicators 2003/04 - has identified that Grampian has the highest recorded accidental dwelling house fires within Scotland. The database of accidental dwelling house fire incidents can be clearly mapped within Aberdeen City to identify specific neighbourhoods where the likelihood of incidents is highest.

Grampian Fire and Rescue Service draft Integrated Risk Management Plan is in the process of public consultation. This process is due for completion in March 2005.

One proposed Task Plan within this plan identifies the desire of the Service to reduce accidental dwelling fires and casualties, this also supports the policy objectives set out in the Fire (Scotland) Bill introduced by the Scottish Executive.

The Fire Service Emergency Fire Cover Model and related statistical data can identify the time frame of these incidents, the age group of the casualties and cause of incidents. This data will allow a local plan to be developed which will address the highest risk areas, the most at risk age group and the most common cause of incidents which result in fire deaths and casualties.

Overall Outcome Targets for Years 1, 2 and 3

- 1% reduction in A&E admissions due to home accidents, each year
- 3% reduction in housebreaking within targeted areas, each year
- 3% reduction in repeat victimisation within targeted areas
- Sustained year on year reduction in accidental housefires and associated casualties. See below for information regarding outcome targets on home fire reduction.

Monitoring and Evaluation:

Lead agencies will provide quarterly monitoring reports to meetings of the Community Safety Partnership giving details of progress, including towards output and outcome targets and milestones.

Aberdeen Community Safety Partnership during its quarterly meetings will oversee progress towards targets and milestones.

Evaluation of media safety campaigns will be conducted through pre and post survey utilising members of Aberdeen City citizens forum.

Grampian Police will monitor the police led interventions via the 2 weekly and Quarterly Tasking and co-ordinating process and evaluate via Statistical and research analysis by Grampian Police Intelligence analysts, relevant to the type of campaign
